Hiawatha Parks and Recreation Regular Meeting September 4, 2018

Dan Wilkes called the meeting to order at 6:08p.m. in the Hiawatha Council Chambers. Present: Michelle McIllece, Dawn Ewoldt, Dan Wilkes Absent: Deb Theis, Brandon Lynch Employees: Kelly Willadsen, Parks and Recreation Director, Ambyr Severson, Administrative Coordinator, Kim Downs, City Administrator and Aime Wichtendahl, City Council Member. Guests: Dan Hoffman

Motion by Dawn Ewoldt, second by Michelle McIllece, to approve the September 4, 2018 agenda as amended. Motion carried. Motion by Michelle McIllece, second by Dawn Ewoldt to approve the minutes of August 14, 2018. Motion carried.

Guthridge Trail Reconstruction: Kelly Willadsen, Director of Parks and Recreation advised the department is looking to replace all the asphalt trail from the middle cross trail to the south (the north end of the trail was constructed later and was installed correctly meaning no updates needed). We believe it will be best to replace the south end trail with new sub-base and asphalt. We would need to excavate a 10' wide path and put 8' of 3" asphalt trail in. Because of the poor subbase on the south end of the trail it is not a candidate for an overlay. Patching is also eliminated because of the difficulty of getting equipment in and out without damaging other portions of the trail. Due to the inability to patch/overlay sections and the lack of meeting ADA requirements we now need \$50,330.00 to complete the project. With \$250,000.00 funds leftover from the purchase of the Taylor property, it will allow us to complete this project, yet still have funding available to put towards the NW park planning. Pate Asphalt Systems came in with the lowest bid and is who we would like to use for the project.

Motion by Michelle McIllece, second by Dawn Ewoldt to recommend to council to approve Guthridge Park Trail updates and use Pate Asphalt Systems to do so. Motion carried.


Homebase lowa Veterans Program: The Home Base lowa program, initiated by former Governor Branstad and Major General Tim Orr, is a public-private partnership with the purpose of honoring veterans and supporting their families in making the transition to a new community in lowa. Under Home Base lowa, businesses submit career opportunities through the Home Base lowa website and offer discounts on services, and municipalities offer discounts on public services such as facility rentals, recreation activities, utility service and building permits, etc. to qualified veterans. Since we already offer low income discounts of 50% off programming we will be adding the same service to our veterans.

Dog Park- Plans Advance for Hiawatha Dog Park: Kelly Willadsen advised that the warranty deed is all we're waiting on for the dog park to begin construction. We'd like to have the trees and seeding done before winter. Dan Wilkes asked what the annual usage would be. Kelly advised she was unsure what the projected usage will be but that they plan on adding additional parking. Kim Downs, City Administrator, added that Linn County was sure to add additional parking in the contract for the dog park so that it's not all at the trailhead.

Hiawatha Kids League Request for Guthridge Park Baseball Diamonds 2019:

Please see the request from HKL chairman Rick Sizemore for Guthridge Park ball diamonds. All of these dates requested work based off of our City schedule.

HiCREW Kiwanis request for 2019 concessions: Please see the attached proposal from Hi-CREW Kiwanis for selling concession at Music in the Park for 2019. New this year, they will be looking at selling pizza. We have not had any other nonprofit interest. They have done a great job over the years and have given pack to the parks and recreation department volunteering at special events, donating to the Clark Park swing set and purchasing dictionaries for the Hiawatha School students.

Park Rental Time Adjustments for 2019: During our annual reflection of the year we like to take a look at our rentals and see how we did, analyze user information, popular times and areas that need more attention. After examining the data, we found that our 6:00-11:30am time slot was rarely utilized (9 rentals out of 310). Many of these rentals were church gatherings, races or breakfast events which use the pavilion for their late morning activities.

With the low usage of this time slot we would like to make a recommendation to change our current park rental times from 6:00am-11:30am, 12:00-4:30pm, 5:00pm-10:00pm, to two timeslots that align more with our current users. We would like to offer two timeslots instead and shift rental times to **8:00am-3:00pm and 4:00pm-10:00pm**. This gives renters the opportunity to have a few more hours for their special events and also allow evening rentals an earlier time slot to set up for afternoon/evening cookouts. These hours also align more closely with our Community Center hours allowing seasonal staff members to complete their cleaning in a more organized manor. Patrons would still be able to rent a pavilion all day from 8:00am-10:00pm and rates are reflected on the chart below:

Although this change could potentially lose funds, we believe it will be beneficial as we'll be allowing our patrons to use our facilities at a better rate while acknowledging their request for longer timeslots. Last year we had 26 all day rentals. At this rate we have the potential to lose \$260, but would gain the support of our patrons all while making it easier on our staff. We would like to transition into this change for 2019 while rentals are still low during the winter season.

Reports:

- **Fall Festival:** It was a windy day in Hiawatha for the Fall Festival but that didn't stop kids from coming to this year's event. The trackless train was a great addition to our trick or treating, Prestige Dance performance and costume contest by Hi-Crew Kiwanis.
- **Teal Trunk or Treat:** This successful event was thrown together in just a couple weeks with the help of local businesses and nonprofits to allow kids with allergies and special diets a one stop shop to trick or treat. 22 cars came together and handed out trinkets to almost 100 kids. It was amazing to see the community come together in just a couple weeks for a good cause!
- Letters to Santa: Add a little magic to the season and receive a letter from Santa, mailed directly to your child. Santa will write a letter in an easy to read format with references of the child's best friend's name, elf on the shelf (if applicable), accomplishments of the year, desired present and more! Each runner will receive a stocking hat with their registration fee along with Hot Cocoa, Candy Canes, Cookies and SANTA when you cross the finish line! Get in the groove during the holiday season! Registration is \$20 per participant, \$25 the week of the race. The proceeds will go towards a new pet fountain at our future Hiawatha Dog Park. Come join the fun and help raise some funds for new park amenities! Last but not least! The Friends of Hiawatha Parks and Recreation Foundation will also be having a food drive for non-perishable food items donated to the HACAP food reservoir to be donated to local families in the corridor.
- **Program Brochure 2019:** We are in the process of planning activities and special events for 2019. Stay tuned for our completed brochure in December. If you have any program ideas let us know, we are always looking for new ideas!

Parks:

Dog Park: Tree removal is on our list to get completed this fall/winter. Our hopes are to get the area cleaned up to see how much sun light we will be able to work with come next spring. We will work with Linn-Coop in March to get accurate ground maintenance scheduled. This will be to get rid of the weeds so we can get grass planted. Fencing, water and entry ways will be to follow, hoping to get the project completed by the end of next year.

We will be having a dog park clean up next weekend on November 17^{th} from 9am-12pm and November 18^{th} from 1pm-4pm. We will be picking up garbage and brush

- to clean up the area. Please come and join if you are available! Boots and gloves will be needed!
- MSA Professional Services: On October 23rd we had 2 council members, 2 park board members and 5 city staff members meet with MSA to go over the last Comp plan and grasp some ideas for the NW area. MSA will meet with focus groups in December to collect information on what our communities wants and desires are. This will help us move forward in planning our NW Park and future City projects. Once they compile information from the focus groups and send out a survey to the Hiawatha residents, they will bring back staff to go over the results so we can present them to the commission.
- **Park Closures**: The parks are now closed for the season! We have one Port a Johnny at Clark and one at Guthridge for our trail users.
- **Guthridge Park Trail Reconstruction:** As you may have noticed, our Guthridge Park Trail Reconstruction project ran into a few road blocks putting the project on hold. With the significant rain fall we experienced in September and October it created a very wet subsoil condition. During the removal of the existing trail, extra material needed to be removed and replaced with new stone to stabilize the base under the new asphalt. With an estimated change order of \$15,000.00 we needed council approval to move forward. At the November 7th meeting they approved us to move forward with the additional expenses. Since it is so late in the year and the asphalt plant closes November 20th, the plan will be to have Pate finish the rock base and complete the paving when spring allows.
